## PCC to offer large slate of short-term courses

While the registration period for Pamlico Community College's curriculum courses has concluded, area residents still have a wide range of short-term Continuing Education options available, including courses in health care, skilled trades and more.

"We'll be offering some of our most popular courses in the weeks ahead," said Lori Giles, Pamlico's chair of Continuing Education and Technical Programs. "Many of these courses can lead to new jobs or enhanced responsibilities and pay at students' current jobs. The new year is a great time to see what's available and to try something new."

Some courses are offered in a seated format, others are entirely online, and several are available in a hybrid seated-online format. Financial aid is available for qualified students.

"The beginning of a new semester is a busy time at the college, but we're ready to help men and women find the courses they need to thrive in 2024," Giles said.

Upcoming course offerings include:

\* Electronic Health Records, an online course for students interested in learning to maintain health information. The course formally began earlier this week, but there's still time to join. The class will run through May. Cost is \$180.55, plus a book.

\* **Electrical Wiring**, a hands-on course that's scheduled to begin today (Jan. 24) on campus. It will meet Wednesday and Thursday evenings through May. Cost is \$180.55.

\* **Forklift Training**, a one-day course set for Saturday, Jan. 27, on the college campus. Participants also will learn to operate a power pallet jack. Hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and the cost is \$70.55.

\* **Notary**, a one-day course scheduled for Saturday, Jan. 27, in Bayboro. It will meet from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Cost is \$70.55, plus a book.

\* Effective Teacher Training, a 30-hour online course designed to help teachers improve their classroom management and instructional techniques. One session will run from Jan. 29 to March 1, while another will begin April 8 and conclude May 10. Cost is \$125.55.

\* **Medical Legal Issues**, an online course slated to start Jan. 29. Explore the laws and ethics related to health care careers in this course, which will conclude in May. Cost is \$180.55.

\* **Phlebotomy Technician**, a daytime course for students who wish to learn how to draw blood for medical tests. The course will start Jan. 30 and will be offered in a hybrid format. Cost is \$180.55.

\* **Medication Aide**, a four-day course for current CNAs who wish to add to their skill sets. The class is set to begin Feb. 1. Cost is \$70.55.

\* **Nurse Aide II**, a daytime course for CNAs who wish to improve their skill levels. It will begin Feb. 5 and will be offered in a hybrid format. Cost is \$180.55.
